Working in partnership with local First Nations, school boards, and other not-for-profits both urban and rural, TRACKS Youth Program takes an Indigenous-and-environmental approach to science education, seeking to engage youth in meaningful, hands-on environmental STEM education that is culturally responsive and rooted in personal and community growth and relationship-building. The program was an inaugural winner of the UL Innovation in Education award, administered by the North American Association of Environmental Educators.

TRACKS engages over 7,000 youth annually through school workshops, outreach, camp events and a youth leadership program, Oshkwazin. Their mentorship-based approach allows the program to build long-lasting relationships with youth, families, communities and partners in the Peterborough and surrounding areas.

"In just six years of active programming, TRACKS Youth Program has grown far beyond what its founding committee at Trent University could have imagined. Each year, it is proven by our camps' high enrolment rates, ever-growing partnerships with First Nations, Indigenous organizations and school boards, as well as positive feedback from participants, parents and teachers, that TRACKS programming is necessary in the greater Peterborough area," said Dr. Chris Furgal, Associate Professor at Trent University. "As a member of Actua, TRACKS hopes to learn from other successful STEM camp programs how to sustainably grow while maintaining its commitment to excellent curriculum delivery and instructor training. TRACKS also hopes to share with other Actua members its vision and passion for bringing together Indigenous knowledge and science in educational programming."
