Cost: Attendance at the InSTEM Educator Land Camp is free of charge.

- Please be aware that a complimentary bus service will depart from Ottawa to transport attendees to the campsite. However, if you opt not to use the bus service or are traveling from outside Ottawa, travel expenses to reach the campsite are not covered.
- Please note that in future stages, a \$100 deposit will be requested from all participating educators to secure your spot at the upcoming Land Camp. Rest assured, upon attendance at The Land Camp, this deposit will be fully refunded. More information to come.
